Your book Aboriginal Rights: Toward An Understanding has recently come to our attention. We feel that this volume would be an important addition to the field of Native Studies. The book deserves major distribution in Canada and abroad; we would like to publish the book for use as a textbook in Canadian universities and for retail sales in major bookstores.


We are a new firm beginning to publish in the field of Native Studies. Our first title, Mni Wakan And The Sioux: Respite, Release and Recreation, will be available in October of this year. The work is a selection of readings concerning alcohol and native people edited by Professor Rodger Hornby of Sinte Gleska College, South Dakota, and Professor Richard Dana of the University of Arkansas. The book has already been selected as a text by three universities including the University of Saskatchewan and Brandon University.

We would propose to publish the book in both cloth and paper cover versions, in a nine by six inch format, with a four colour cover by a native artist. The book would be set in 10 point Pyramid medium, and would be perfect bound in the paper version with a laminated cover. We would give a copy of the book to each contributor and pay a royalty of 9% of gross sales, either to you as the editors (3% each editor), or to your University as specified by you.

We would actively undertake to promote the book. To facilitate a widespread distribution we would keep the sale price as low as possible.

I hope to hear from you in the near future regarding the publication of your book.
